

WELCOME AND CALL TO WORSHIP (please stand)

Minister: Blessed be God: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit.

People: And blessed be his kingdom, now and for ever. Amen.

THE COLLECT FOR PURITY (please kneel)

Almighty God, to you all hearts are open, all desires known, and from you no secrets are hid: Cleanse the thoughts of our hearts by the inspiration of your Holy Spirit, that we may perfectly love you, and worthily magnify your holy Name; through Christ our Lord. Amen.

THE SUMMARY OF THE LAW

Minister: Hear what our Lord Jesus Christ says: You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind. This is the first and great commandment. And the second is like it: You shall love your neighbor as yourself. On these two commandments depend all the Law and the Prophets.

THE NICENE CREED (please stand)

THE PRAYERS OF THE PEOPLE (please kneel)

Reader: Gathered in the name of Jesus, united by the power of the Holy Spirit, let us pray to our Father saying, Lord, in your mercy, hear our prayer.

Reader: For the peace of the whole world, and for the well-being and unity of the people of God. We ask especially for peace and resolution to wars in the Middle East, Ukraine, and Sudan, that all people may be gathered under the banner of the Prince of Peace. *Silence*

Reader: Lord, in your mercy, *People:* Hear our prayer.

Reader: For Steve, our Archbishop, Foley our Bishop, and Frank, our Assisting Bishop, and for all the clergy and people of the Anglican Diocese of the South, especially Good Samaritan Anglican Church in Sugar Hill, Georgia . *Silence*

Reader: Lord, in your mercy, *People:* Hear our prayer.

Reader: For this congregation of St. Andrew's, for our clergy, staff, vestry, and all the ministries God has called us to, especially for our youth and their leaders as they meet today for fellowship and worship. *Silence*

Reader: Lord, in your mercy, *People:* Hear our prayer.

Reader: For all those who proclaim the Gospel at home and abroad; and for all who teach and disciple others, *Silence*

Reader: Lord, in your mercy, *People:* Hear our prayer.

Reader: For our brothers and sisters in Christ who are persecuted for their faith, especially Huma in Pakistan; and for all Christians in Algeria, where the government has ordered the closure of all Protestant churches, forcing thousands of believers to worship in isolation. *Silence*

Reader: Lord, in your mercy, *People:* Hear our prayer.

Reader: For our nation, for those in authority and for all in public service, especially our president, Donald, and our governor, Andy. *Silence*

Reader: Lord, in your mercy, *People:* Hear our prayer.

Reader: For all those who are in trouble, sorrow, need, sickness, or any other adversity. We pray for John and Ellen Backs in bereavement for her father, Don Savio.

(Please pray silently or aloud for those in need)

Reader: Lord, in your mercy, *People:* Hear our prayer.

Minister: Heavenly Father, grant these our prayers for Jesus Christ's sake, our only Mediator and Advocate, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. *Amen*.

THE CONFESSION AND DECLARATION OF FORGIVENESS

Minister: Let us humbly confess our sins to Almighty God. (*saying together*)

Most merciful God, we confess that we have sinned against you in thought, word and deed, by what we have done, and by what we have left undone. We have not loved you with our whole heart; we have not loved our neighbors as ourselves. We are truly sorry and we humbly repent. For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ, have mercy on us and forgive us; that we may delight in your will, and walk in your ways, to the glory of your Name. Amen.

Minister: Almighty God, our heavenly Father, who in his great mercy has promised forgiveness of sins to all those who sincerely repent and with true faith turn to him, have mercy upon you, pardon and deliver you from all your sins, confirm and strengthen you in all goodness, and bring you to everlasting life; through Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen*.

THE COMFORTABLE WORDS

Minister: Hear the Word of God to all who truly turn to him:

Come to me, all who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest.

THE HOLY COMMUNION

Minister: The Lord be with you.

People: And with your spirit.

Minister: Lift up your hearts.

People: We lift them up to the Lord.

Minister: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. *People:* It is right to give Him thanks and praise.

It is right, our duty and our joy, always and everywhere to give thanks to you, Father Almighty, Creator of heaven and earth, through Jesus Christ our Lord, who on the first day of the week overcame death and the grave, and by his glorious resurrection opened to us the way of everlasting life.

Therefore we praise you, joining our voices with Angels and Archangels and with all the company of heaven, who forever sing this hymn to proclaim the glory of your Name:

THE PRAYER OF CONSECRATION (please kneel)

Holy and gracious Father: In your infinite love you made us for yourself; and when we had sinned against you and become subject to evil and death, you, in your mercy, sent your only Son into the world for our salvation. By the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary he became flesh and dwelt among us. In obedience to your will, he stretched out his arms upon the cross and offered himself once for all, that by his suffering and death we might be saved. By his resurrection he broke the bonds of death, trampling Hell and Satan under his feet. As our great high priest, he ascended to your right hand in glory, that we might come with confidence before the throne of grace.

On the night that he was betrayed, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying, "Take, eat; this is my Body which is given for you: Do this in remembrance of me."

Likewise, after supper, Jesus took the cup, and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, saying, "Drink this, all of you; for this is my Blood of the New Covenant, which is shed for you, and for many, for the forgiveness of sins: Whenever you drink it, do this in remembrance of me."

Therefore we proclaim the mystery of faith: (saying together)

Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.

We celebrate the memorial of our redemption, O Father, in this sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving, and we offer you these gifts. Sanctify them by your Word and Holy Spirit to be for your people the Body and Blood of your Son Jesus Christ. Sanctify us also, that we may worthily receive this holy sacrament, and be made one body with him, so that he may dwell in us and we in him. In the fullness of time, put all things in subjection under Your Christ, and bring us with all your saints into the joy of your heavenly kingdom, where we shall see our Lord face to face.

All this we ask through your Son Jesus Christ: By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and forever. *Amen*.

And now, as our Savior Christ has taught us, we are bold to pray:

Our Father, who art in heaven, allowed be thy Name.

Thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth, as it is in heaven.

Give us this day our daily bread.

And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us.

And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil.

For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.

Minister: Alleluia! Christ our Passover Lamb has been sacrificed, once

for all upon the cross.

People: Therefore let us keep the feast. Alleluia!

THE PRAYER OF HUMBLE ACCESS (said by all)

We do not presume to come to this your table, O merciful Lord, trusting in our own righteousness, but in your abundant and great mercies. We are not worthy so much as to gather up the crumbs under your table; but you are the same Lord whose character is always to have mercy. Grant us, therefore, gracious Lord, so to eat the flesh of your dear Son Jesus Christ and to drink his blood, that our sinful bodies may be made clean by his body, and our souls washed through his most precious blood, and that we may evermore dwell in him, and he in us. Amen.
